In Michigan,are currently incarcerated, with a staggering 29-fold growth in the prison population between 1980 and 2010.

Of prisoners are categorized as "nonwhite," despite making up only 14% of the state's population

Employment prospects for returning citizens in Michigan are significantly low, and it's families, particularly children of incarcerated parents, who suffer the most as a result of this challenge..

This initiative aims to improve public safety by reducing crime through comprehensive support for returning citizens, from their time in prison to successful reintegration into the North Flint community.



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By providing essential services for sustainable housing and employment, and empower returning citizens to contribute positively to society.

The project's mission is to build upon this success by cutting the 26% failure rate of North Flint's former state prisoners in half within three years.

Leon El-Alamin

The founder and Executive Director of the M.A.D.E. Institute, a nonprofit organization that stands for Money, Attitude, Direction and Education.

Growing up on the north side of Flint, Leon was a good kid who took refuge at his grandmother's house to escape the challenges he faced at home and out on the streets. After graduating from high school, the allure of earning fast money made Leon start hustling drugs.


A few years later, a shootout over a drug turf war landed him in the hospital where he spent a month in a coma. The incident led to his eventual arrest and imprisonment on drug and weapons charges. At the age of 30, Leon was released from prison after serving part of a 12-20-year sentence. Several years after his release he launched the M.A.D.E. Institute in 2015.

Leon is a graduate of Mott Community College's workforce Development Green construction Program. He is also certified as a Youth Mental Health First Aid Recovery Coach through Genesee Health System and served on the City of Flint's 1st Ward Zoning Board of Appeals Officer..

How do we help?

Is an evidence-based model of care for people with chronic health conditions returning to the community from incarceration.


