Poly-Substance Use Concerns

Fentanyl laced substances

Xylazine

Non-opioid veterinary sedative/anesthetic
Opioid S&S presentation, non-reactive to naloxone



Blue – MCA adopted – not implemented


Green – MCA Adopted & Implemented

 - ■Patients >15 years of age
 - Alternative Destination
 - With MCA Approval

Drug Overdose Anomaly Response Protocol (DARP)



How are we using EMS data?

All EMS agencies report data to MiEMSIS (Michigan data repository)

biospatial is a national platform that ingests EMS data

Syndromes are applied to EMS responses in biospatial

How are anomalies detected in biospatial?

Creates predicted distribution of EMS runs, for given syndrome

Compares to observed number of runs for given date

Flags abnormally high observed counts

Generates email

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
